#### University of Redlands and Tuskegee University Forge Historic Agreement

A first-of-its-kind agreement for both institutions, the University of Redlands, a private liberal art, graduate and professional university in Southern California, and Tuskegee University have partnered to provide expanded opportunities for students and faculty. The new options for students and faculty will include residence at the partner institution for up to one year.

Tuskegee University students within this agreement will be able to study away at the University of Redlands for TU credit. A variety of courses will be transferable toward TU students curriculum



Mr. Warren Duncan, Head of Department of Fine and Performing Arts and Director of Bands, has been appointed by the Governor of Alabama, Kay Ivey, to the Alabama State Council on the Arts. The Council is to make decisions on grants awarded to support art programs and arts education

Tuskegee University Integrative Biosciences Ph.D. was started in 2005 and has produced 26 Ph.Ds. Students have gone on to work at the University of Pittsburgh, Morehouse, Temple University, Troy University, University of California San Francisco, the CDC, FDA, EPA, USDA, and more.

CAS Dean Dr. Prakash was invited by Captain Karl Minter, a member of the Tuskegee University Board of Trustees to attend the annual convention of the Organization of Black Aerospace Professionals in Orlando, FL, where he also addressed the Advisory Council of OBAP.

The Summer workshop on Plant Genomics and Biotechnology for 6-12 grade teachers and students held at Tuskegee University provided HS teachers and students with a perspective on contemporary issues in science and biotechnology as they relate to global food and energy issues. They also received hands-on experience with basic laboratory techniques related to genomics. Dr. Jacquelyn Jackson of Tuskegee College of Agriculture, Environment and Nutrition Sciences and Dr. Prakash, CAS Dean organized the meeting.

"Drone Zone Summer Program" for middle school students from Macon County was conducted during June 2017 by Dr. Chadia Aji of the Department of Math along with Dr. Javed Khan of the Department of Aerospace Engineering.

Dr. Aji and Dr. Khan received a grant for \$300,000 to help advance Tuskegee University's strategic priorities to enhance student success in STEM programs, increase student retention, improve long-term graduation rates, and expand the university's online education offerings.

# Gift from a Late, Great Alumnus



Tuskegee University has received a generous estate gift valued at \$1.59 million — the largest planned gift received by the university to date — from 1943 Tuskegee University graduate Dr. Orlando Lawrence Clark. Clark, a resident of San Francisco, was 92 at the time of his death in June 2014. The donation from his estate will augment Tuskegee's endowment and provide students with scholarships for generations to come.
