Eligibility

The program is open to high school and undergraduate who are interested in organic agriculture and may be interested in pursuing a career in sustainable food production as a producer, crop advisor, Ag extension professional, organic inspector, sustainable food production researcher or other sustainable agricultural professional.



Project Overview

This is an opportunity to engage in systems-based experiential training in organic farming at Tuskegee University's Certified Organic Research Farm from **June 2nd to July 31st, 2025.**

To fulfil the whole hands-on experience, this program will cover the following:

1. Policies and regulations governing organic food production as well as basic information on relevant regulatory agencies.
2. Informational sessions and hands-on training on the following aspects of organic crop production.
 - (a) Preparation of fields for organic vegetable production
 - (b) Agronomy, soil management, horticulture, and pest management.
 - (c) Post-harvest handling of organic vegetables.
 - (d) Food safety
 - (e) Marketing of organic vegetables.
