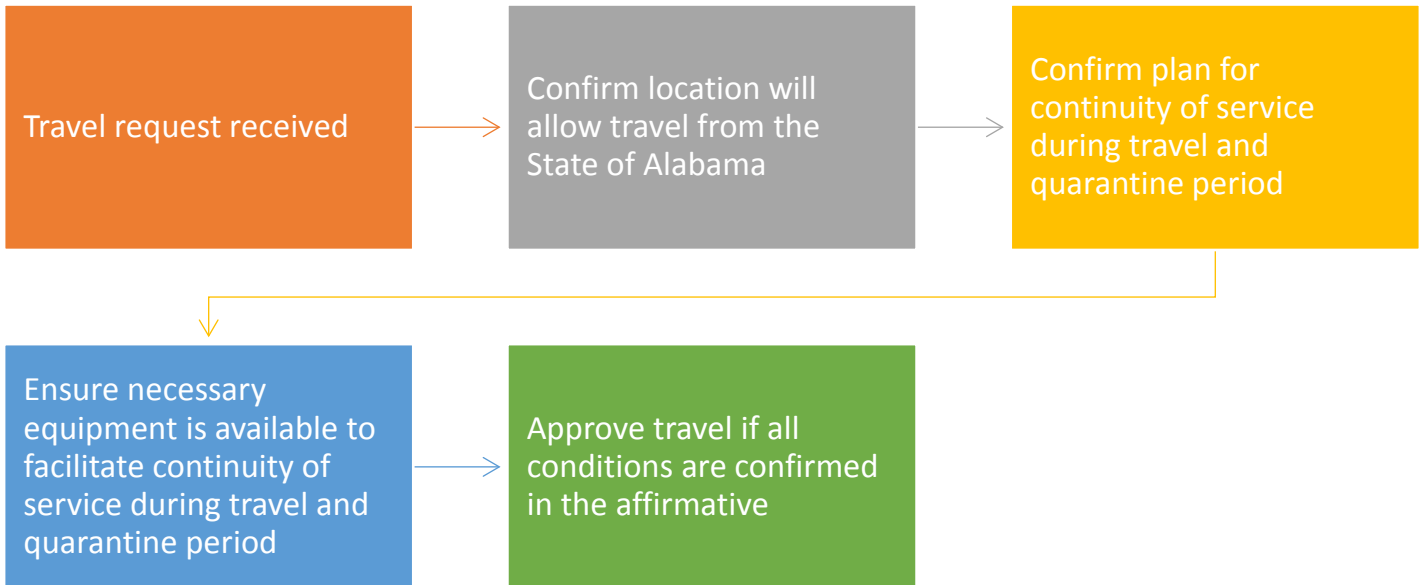




Travel Guidelines and Checklist

Tuskegee University has resumed domestic travel to activities, events, and conferences. Travel increases your chances of contracting and spreading COVID-19. Those students, faculty, and staff who are approved to travel via personal vehicle, bus, train or airplane should ensure they are in good health and follow important safety protocols listed below.



Domestic Travel Guidelines

Domestic travel is permitted at the discretion of the supervisor. Domestic student travel is permitted for academic and co-curricular purposes at the discretion of the appropriate academic or administrative department. When planning domestic travel, please review travel guidance for the intended destination [here](#) as some states have testing and quarantine requirements upon entry. Upon return, please follow the protocols listed below.

- Developed a plan for continuity of service (mask, physical distancing, sanitizing) during travel.
- After travel, quarantine for three (3) days and obtain and present a negative COVID-19 PCR Test immediately following the quarantine period.
- Self-monitor for COVID-19 symptoms for 14 days.
- Ensure you have necessary laptop, internet, and other necessary equipment in the event that you need to work or attend class remotely.

International Travel

Tuskegee University has not authorized international travel for university business. However, we understand that individuals may choose to travel internationally for personal and family reasons. It is expected that you will follow the guidelines listed below.

- Developed a plan for continuity of service (mask, physical distancing, sanitizing) during travel.
- After travel, quarantine for ten (10) days and obtain and present a negative COVID-19 PCR Test immediately following the quarantine period.
- Self-monitor for COVID-19 symptoms for 14 days.
- Ensure you have necessary laptop, internet, and other necessary equipment in the event that you need to work or attend class remotely.
