## Unfunded Grants

Several external grant applications for which I would have been PI have not been funded. However, the work planned for many of them has been made possible by other grants. For example, key components of an well-reviewed but unfunded USDA *Value Added Producer* led to greater farm management practice and local production strategy for a limited resource female owned minority farm in the Alabama Black Belt.

My most recent unfunded proposal was to the USDA/NIFA Community Food Projects Competitive Grant Program for *Healing from Within: Planning a Strengthened Food System in the Alabama Black Belt.* It builds on a very successful pilot however; we did not make that cut. We will re-apply next year.
