Inaugural Dr. Frederick Douglass Patterson Opening Plenary Session



The **Inaugural Dr. Frederick Douglass Patterson Opening Plenary Session** has been established to rename the previous Veterinary Symposium's General Session to honor the profound contributions of Dr. Frederick Douglass Patterson (a.k.a. Frederick D. Patterson) who served as the third president of Tuskegee Institute (now Tuskegee University) from 1935-1953.

Who was Dr. Frederick D. Patterson?... Dr. Frederick Douglass Patterson was named after Black journalist and anti-slavery leader Frederick Douglass. Patterson was born on October 10, 1901, but orphaned at age two and raised by his eldest sister. He studied at Iowa State College, where he received a doctorate degree in veterinary medicine in 1923 followed by a master's of science degree in 1927. Five years later, he received a second doctorate degree from Cornell University. Patterson taught veterinary science for four years at Virginia State College and also served as their Director of Agriculture.

What was Dr. Frederick D. Patterson's Tuskegee Connection?... Patterson married Catherine Elizabeth Moton, who was the daughter of Tuskegee University's second president, Dr. Robert R. Moton. His tenure at Tuskegee University started in 1928 and covered over two decades almost reaching 25 years. He first served as Head of the Veterinary Division, Director of the School of Agriculture from 1933-35 and finally as Tuskegee's third President from 1935-1953. It was Patterson who founded the School of Veterinary Medicine at Tuskegee in 1944, served as Acting Dean of the School of Veterinary Medicine for one year, and then the same year he also established the United Negro College Fund (UNCF). The UNCF continues today as a critical source of annual income for a consortium of Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCUs), in which Tuskegee University is among them.

What was Dr. Frederick D. Patterson's Impact Beyond Tuskegee?... Dr. Patterson is considered to have had an impact that touched many states across America. For example, the UNCF became the largest independent source of income for African American institutions across America. It provided for student scholarships, staff salaries, library resources, laboratories, and new teaching programs, which spanned across America. Patterson was a member of President Truman's Commission on Higher Education. He helped write the 1947 report that helped reorganize higher education in the United States and included aspects for ending racial segregation in institutions of higher education in the South. Patterson is also credited with having founded the College Endowment Funding Plan for which he was recognized by U.S. President Ronald Reagan in 1985 and then honored with the Presidential Medal of Freedom by him in 1987 before his death in 1988 at the age of 86.

In summary, **Dr. Frederick Douglass Patterson** was a **leader, a visionary, an advocate, an innovator, a humanitarian, an educator, a treasure** to Tuskegee University who set the path in motion for the over eight decade history of the first professional veterinary medical school located at a HBCU!

Inaugural Dr. Frederick Douglass Patterson Opening Plenary Session Keynote Speaker

Michael Q. Bailey, DDVM, DACVR, AAAS/AVMA Fellow AVMA President 2025-2026



Dr. Michael Q. Bailey, born in Queens, New York, was raised in Hopewell, New Jersey, where he earned his undergraduate degree from Rutgers University's College of Agriculture and Environmental Sciences before obtaining his DVM in 1982 from the historic Tuskegee University in Alabama. Following this, he completed a comprehensive internship and radiology residency at Michigan State University.

As a board-certified radiologist, Dr. Bailey has contributed to a range of veterinary and human medical literature and, to this day, shares his expertise with audiences worldwide, allowing him to connect with and learn from thousands of colleagues across the globe. His body of work is a testament to his commitment to advancing knowledge in the medical field.

Dr. Bailey's academic and professional journey has included serving on the faculty at prestigious institutions such as Tuskegee and Michigan State University. He achieved tenure at The Ohio State University, reflecting his dedication to education and research.

Fortunate to have had the opportunity to partake in an AAAS/AVMA congressional fellowship, Dr. Bailey was a full-time scientific legislative advisor in a congressional office while learning how Capitol Hill works. He applied his scientific veterinary medical expertise to topics of interest to lawmakers, shaping and influencing legislation. In this role, Dr. Bailey valued the collaboration with members of Congress and their staff, and participating in constituent services.

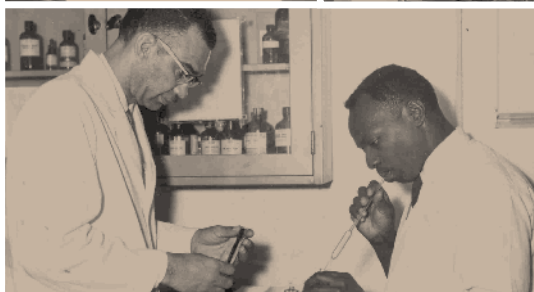
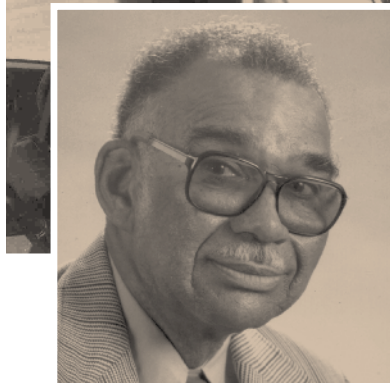
Dr. Bailey pioneered Ohio's inaugural private practice advanced veterinary CT imaging services and launched referral and emergency imaging facilities in Pittsburgh. As the lead radiologist for a nationwide veterinary practice with over 1,000 facilities, he was pivotal in nationwide distributed veterinary imaging services and telemedicine. Dr. Bailey currently serves as the director of medical innovations in telemedicine for a global telemedicine consulting business, where he brings his extensive telemedicine expertise to the forefront.

Dr. Bailey has been very active in veterinary volunteer leadership at the state and national levels. His leadership journey includes serving on the Pennsylvania Veterinary Medical Association (PVMA) board and as PVMA president. He also served a six-year term on the AVMA Board of Directors, representing District 2, which encompasses New Jersey, Delaware, Maryland, Virginia, Pennsylvania, and the District of Columbia.

In his leisure time, Dr. Bailey finds joy in traveling with his wife and indulges in hobbies such as rebuilding classic cars and motorcycles, along with a passion for photography.



The career of Dean Williams is a very important link in the history of Tuskegee's veterinary medical school. We are reminded of his contributions through such landmark honors as the Veterinary Alumni Symposium Lecture Series, the Veterinary Medical Library and a Food Animal Research Building that bear his name. His contributions go far beyond these tangible recognitions and attention must be drawn to his less obvious but equally important contributions.



University Distinguished Alumni Service Award in 1959, the Norden Award for Distinguished Teaching in Veterinary Medicine in 1963, and the Tuskegee Faculty Achievement Award in 1973. In 1991, Tuskegee University honored Dr. Williams with the naming of the veterinary school's T. S. Williams Veterinary Medical Library, and in March 2002, with the dedication of Williams-Bowie Hall which recognized the contributions of both former Deans Emeriti, Dr. T.S. Williams and Dr. Walter C. Bowie. The building was formerly known as the Food Animal

Production, Research, and Service Center, a multipurpose facility used for teaching, research, and computer-assisted learning.

Dr. Williams also served as the president of the Association of American Veterinary Medical Colleges (AAVMC) from 1968 to 1969 and as the president of the American Association of Veterinary Anatomists (AAVA) in 1969.

Since its inception, the lecture series has represented the ideals of Dean Emeritus Williams emphasizing the highest standards of scholarship and teaching in advancing veterinary medical education. Veterinary alumni were invited to present topics of interest in a venue supplemental to the regular symposium program. The impact of the presentations on returning veterinarians and students propelled the lecture series to become an integral part of the Annual Veterinary Symposium and continue to be supported by the TVMAA. Dr. T.S. Williams was always present for the presentations until health challenges prevented his attendance prior to his death.

The first T. S. Williams lecturer was the late Dr. Laval N. Cothran ('57). There have been many alumni and non-alumni veterinary researchers and administrators that followed as lecturers to continue Dean Williams' legacy of advancing veterinary medical education.

The TVMAA continues to serve as a participating partner with the Tuskegee University College of Veterinary Medicine (TUCVM) in support of the T.S. Williams Lecture Series.

T.S. Williams Lecture History

The T.S. Williams Lecture was established in 1978 by the Tuskegee Veterinary Medical Alumni Association, Inc. (TVMAA) Executive Council under the presidential leadership of Dr. Adam E. McKee, Jr. This event honors the late Dr. Theodore Shields Williams, Sr. who served the Tuskegee University (then Tuskegee Institute) School of Veterinary Medicine as the second dean from 1947- 1972. Dr. Williams was born in Kansas City, Kansas on June 2, 1911. He earned the Doctor of Veterinary Medicine (DVM) degree from Kansas State University in 1935, and practiced in Kansas City, Kansas before joining the faculty in 1936 at Prairie View State Normal & Industrial College (Prairie View A & M University) in Texas. He was employed by the Federal Meat Inspection Service, United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) in Des Moines, Iowa from 1936-1945. Dr. Williams completed the Master's degree in Veterinary Pathology in 1946 from Iowa State College (Iowa State University), and his area of research dealt with pathological lesions associated with tissue invading migratory parasites in animals. Dr. Williams was appointed as the Head of the Department of Pathology and Parasitology and served from 1945-1951 and later appointed as dean and served in this role from 1947-1972. Under his deanship, the first class of five students graduated in 1949. He returned to the faculty and served as Professor of Pathology and Parasitology until his retirement in 1981. From 1981 until his death on April 15, 2002, he was dean emeritus and professor emeritus at the Tuskegee University School of Veterinary Medicine. His honors and recognitions include the Kansas State

Dr. Michael J. Blackwell serves as Director of the Program for Pet Health Equity at the University of Tennessee, where he leads national efforts to improve access to veterinary care—especially for families with limited means. His work is grounded in a vision of health equity that recognizes pets as essential members of the family. Dr. Blackwell received his DVM from Tuskegee University in 1975.

A retired Assistant Surgeon General and Rear Admiral in the U.S. Public Health Service (USPHS), Dr. Blackwell served for 23 years in active duty, holding key national leadership roles, including:

- Chief of Staff, Office of the U.S. Surgeon General
- Deputy Director, Center for Veterinary Medicine, U.S. Food and Drug Administration
- Chief Veterinary Officer, U.S. Public Health Service

He also served as Dean of the College of Veterinary Medicine at the University of Tennessee, advancing One Health initiatives and interprofessional collaboration.

Dr. Blackwell has received numerous honors, including the USPHS Distinguished Service Medal, Meritorious Service Medal, and two Surgeon General's Exemplary Service Medals. He is the 2020 Avanzino Leadership Award recipient, the 2021 Senator John Melcher, DVM Leadership in Public Policy Award honoree, and the 2025 recipient of the American Veterinary Medical Association's Frederick D. Patterson Lifetime Achievement Award.

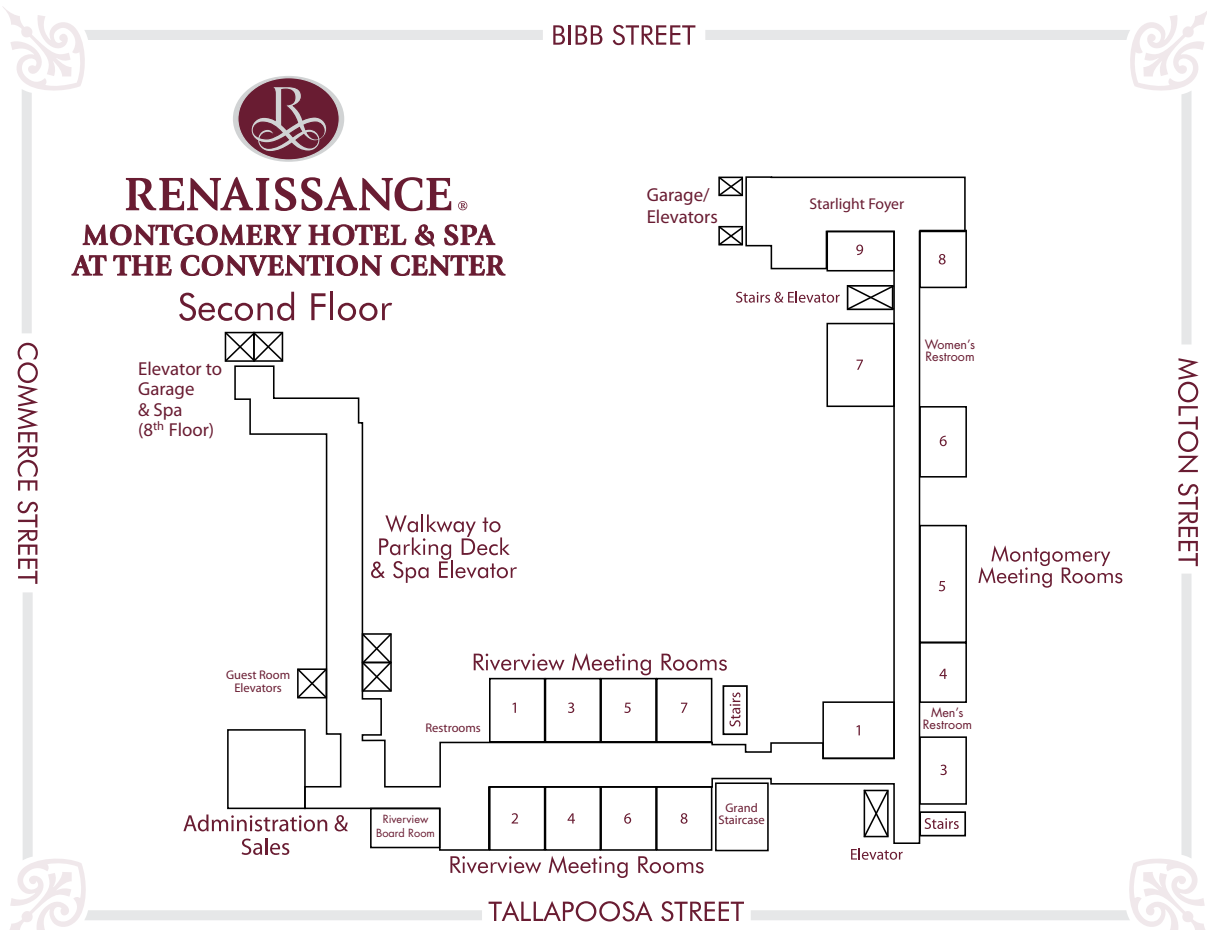
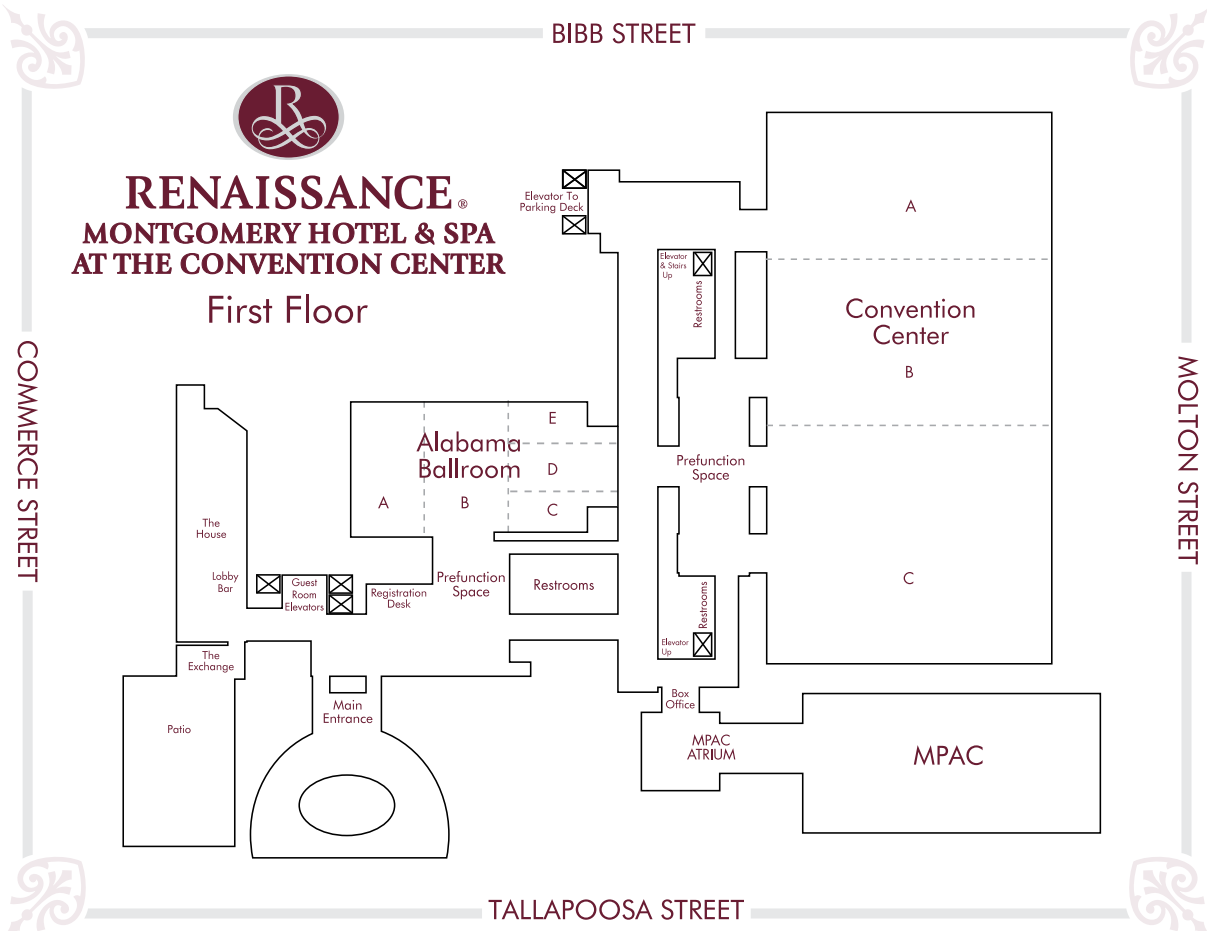
